

“STAY SAFE” WITH US!

What we ask of you to “STAY SAFE”:

- Wash your hands often with warm soapy water and lather and scrub hands for 20 seconds. When soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizers containing 60% alcohol.
- Perform hand hygiene when entering or leaving your home, our facilities and out in the community.
- Be sure to keep your hands away from your face.
- Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces regularly, including your phone.
- Cover your cough or sneeze into your elbow or a tissue, discard the tissue immediately and perform hand hygiene.
- Wear a mask covering your nose and mouth in our facilities and anywhere outside your home. Wash your hands before and after removing a face mask.
- Avoid non-essential outings and maintain social distancing of 6’ or greater.
- Contact your primary care provider if you have the symptoms of fever, cough, fatigue and difficulty breathing, and have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19.
- If you have mild symptoms and have not been tested, the CDC guidelines recommend you self-isolate.
- If you tested positive with mild symptoms, you need to self-isolate.

What we are doing to keep you “SAFE”:

- Patients who are positive for COVID-19 are being cared for in an isolated unit, as are persons under investigation.
- We are limiting the number of people entering our facilities in an effort to keep those in our community who are potentially infected with COVID-19 from infecting our staff who need to remain healthy to provide patient care to you and your loved ones.
- Anyone entering the hospital’s public entrances is screened for symptoms.
- Employees, like you, are monitoring for symptoms.
- We are wearing other appropriate personal protective equipment, including gloves, gowns and face shields during procedures.
- All employees are required to wear masks covering their noses and mouths.
- As much as possible, we are social distancing in our work areas.
- We are diligently performing hand hygiene as this is the best defense in infection control and prevention.
- Common areas are being routinely disinfected at an increased level and frequency. Tru-D, our advanced remote-controlled environmental ultraviolet disinfection system is being used for high level disinfecting to kill germs found on contact surfaces.
